Re: 2022-23 Budget Request for Medi-Cal Provider Data Sharing and Infrastructure

Dear Governor Newsom, Pro Tem Atkins and Speaker Rendon:

We write today to request that this year's state budget include a \$100 million General Fund allocation to accelerate Medi-Cal provider data sharing and build the data infrastructure needed to deliver on our commitment to improve Medi-Cal quality, address longstanding equity concerns and make the promise of whole person care a reality.

A \$100 million investment in this year's budget, and ongoing state-federal financing through Medi-Cal, will support two critical and inter-connected programs:

- Performance payments for Medi-Cal providers that join and share data with qualified health information organizations (HIOs), providing resources and motivation for small physician practices, behavioral health and safety-net clinics, skilled nursing facilities, county health and human services and hospitals to join and share data with HIOs. Experience from other states and from within California demonstrates that financial incentives can rapidly accelerate HIO participation and data sharing. These performance payments would be matched 50/50 by the federal government.
- Funding for qualified HIOs to build and maintain the health data infrastructure needed for California Advancing and Innovating Medi-Cal (<u>CalAIM</u>) to succeed. California has committed over \$2.6 billion in state funds for this sweeping set of Medi-Cal delivery system reforms. But that commitment will falter without the timely clinical and other health data needed to coordinate care, improve quality, fill prevention gaps, identify high risk patients and address disparities.

With the funding in our request, qualified HIOs will connect to Medi-Cal providers' electronic health records and aggregate and clean clinical data to support CalAIM and other Medi-Cal activities including enhanced care management, community supports, behavioral health system modernization, quality improvement and population health management. DHCS can draw down enhanced federal matching funds for this work.

These two initiatives will address the <u>substantial data gaps</u> identified by California Health and Human Services Agency (CalHHS) in December 2021—including and especially organizations' capacity to store, electronically share, and use health and human service information.

The Governor's 2022-23 proposed January budget did not include resources to implement the statewide <u>Health and Human Services Data Exchange Framework</u> alongside our bold efforts to transform and strengthen Medi-Cal. The undersigned coalition stands ready to work with you on ensuring funding for these linked priorities in the final spending plan. California needs to invest now to accelerate provider data sharing, integrate clinical information, and support the data infrastructure essential for the success of CalAIM and our public health and equity goals.
