

Request for Proposal (RFP) by Manifest MedEx For Ambulatory Practice Recruitment

Issued: December 2, 2019

Proposal Due Date: January 17, 2020

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Manifest MedEx Background

Manifest MedEx (MX) is a health information exchange in California helping physicians, hospitals and health plans meet their goals of improving care, reducing costs and enhancing health. As the largest nonprofit health data network in California, Manifest MedEx shares health records for 19 million Californians and supports HIE services for 500 health care organizations, including ambulatory practices, health plans, and county agencies and over 90 hospitals. MX is currently connected with 6 health plans in California. MX brings together both claims and clinical data to enable access to longitudinal patient records, real-time event notifications, reporting, and advanced analytics. It is one of few HIEs nationally that is HITRUST certified.

In 2020 MX is expanding our ambulatory care footprint in California. Community providers are uniquely situated to improve care and reduce unnecessary costs. They help patients navigate transitions in care, manage chronic conditions, avoid hospital readmissions, access preventive services and manage medications. They are leaders in value-based models, such as accountable care organizations. Yet they often lack key insights about the care patients receive outside the clinic or tools to identify patients who are at risk or need extra support. MX aims to onboard over 4,500 ambulatory care providers by the end of 2020 so we can help them improve care, reduce cost and enhance health through tools, insights and data. Recruitment will focus on medical groups or practices that employ three or more eligible providers as defined in this RFP. Medical groups and practices receive MX services free of charge.


Subcontractor Overview

Building off successful models in other states, Manifest MedEx is seeking to hire four or more subcontractor organizations to recruit and sign up ambulatory groups and practices to participate in the Manifest MedEx HIE. These subcontractors will be considered representatives of MX in the field and in doctor's practices.

MX is looking for subcontractors that can rapidly sign up providers in certain regions of California not currently covered by MX's partner Health Information Organizations.

MX will pay subcontractors for each eligible medical group or practice recruited, defined as receipt by MX of a full sign-up package including the following materials submitted and signed by the medical group or practice:

- 1. MX Participation Agreement and Business Associate Agreement (PA and BAA)
- 2. Letter of intent (LOI) to participate in Cal-HOP
- 3. Laboratory and radiology authorization forms
- 4. Organizational profile with provider NPI list and list of providers/staff to credential for use of MX's system
- 5. Active patient panel in MX's patient panel format





To be eligible medical groups and practices must meet these two criteria:

- Has 3 or more full-time providers who are licensed MDs, physician assistants or nurse practitioners with specialization in internal medicine, family practice, pediatrics, cardiology, pulmonology, endocrinology, and OB-GYN
- Uses one of the following electronic health record systems:
 - o athenahealth, Allscripts, Cerner, eClinicalWorks, Epic, Greenway, Meditech, NextGen, and Practice Fusion

Subcontractors will receive the following payment for each eligible medical group or practice recruited, as defined above:

- 3-10 full-time providers \$2,000
- 11-24 full-time providers \$8,000
- 25 or more full-time providers \$10,000

The total budget for this project is capped at \$2,000,000. MX will not pay for subcontractor's travel and other expenses, or for attendance at required training. Subcontractors will receive payment upon successful recruitment of medical groups and practices as described above.

MX will support awarded subcontractors in their outreach efforts by providing them with the following assistance:

- Onboarding training
- Template marketing materials
- Overview of MX
- Messaging and FAQs
- Bi-weekly one-on-one's with program team to discuss questions, progress, and risks

Subcontractor Performance

A subcontractor's performance will be continuously evaluated by MX. Subcontractors' performance will be assessed quarterly to ensure they are reaching their goals and performing satisfactorily using criteria such as the following:

- Performance achieving recruitment goals in their given region/regions
- Timeliness and completeness of documentation for practice enrollment
- Professional and high-integrity interaction with MX, target practices and other stakeholders
- Outreach and engagement activities: at a minimum, subcontractors will be responsible for hosting at least one in-person event per quarter and two supplemental activities such as webinars or podcasts per quarter
- Attendance at trainings and meetings organized by MX
- HIE, MX and Cal-HOP knowledge

The scope of the subcontractor's work will be finalized by MX through the contracting process.



Underperforming subcontractors may be terminated at the discretion of MX. MX may reissue this RFP or contract with additional subcontractors to ensure geographical coverage across the state or achieve other goals.

Objective of this RFP

The objective of this RFP is to identify organizations interested in contracting with MX to recruit ambulatory medical groups and practices. MX will assess the subcontractor organizations that reply to this RFP on their HIE knowledge, credibility, experience working with eligible professionals on similar programs, and ability to recruit eligible practices.

To be eligible for consideration, candidate subcontractor organizations should submit a proposal by the deadline including the following information:

- Organization overview
- Key personnel
- Past experience
- Organizational capacity and project plan
- Target practices
- References

Eligible Subcontractors

MX is requiring subcontractors be California-based companies. Subcontracting organizations could include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Organizations with extensive experience in the California market providing services to medical groups and practices related to:
 - Health information technology adoption and use
 - o State or federal quality improvement efforts
 - Practice transformation
 - o EHR adoption, Meaningful Use, HIE onboarding, and/or value-based payment arrangement adoption
- Independent Provider Associations located in California
- Organizations that lead health information technology focused technical assistance programs across the state of California
- Medical associations and societies

Organizations are <u>not</u> eligible to be a subcontractor if they meet any of the following conditions:

- are currently engaged in another recruitment effort with MX
- are a hospital or health system

MX may also exclude organizations that directly receive funding from the Cal-HOP program.

Subcontractors are required to be Business Associates of MX.



Subcontractor Territory Specifications

Once awarded, the subcontractor will be assigned regions based on their submitted recruitment targets and regions. If there is more than one subcontractor in a given region, MX will assign practices to a single subcontractor or otherwise coordinate across subcontractors.

Subcontractor and practice recruitment will focus on the following regions highlighted in blue on the map:

In addition to these regions, subcontractors may apply to recruit eligible practices in other regions across California.





RFP Response Review Process

The MX team will review and score RFP submissions using the following domains:

- The deadline for submitting proposals is January 17, 2020 by 5:00pm (PST)

Responses should be no longer than 20 pages, not including staff resumes.
